

YOU WILL NEED:

Pencil, paper, eraser and felf pen.




SPECIAL TIP ...

Don't press too hard with the pencil when you do this drawing.



LIGHTLY DRAW IN
EYES, NOSE,
EARS AND
BASIC HEAD
SHAPE







STEP 5 NOW, USING THE FELT PEN, DRAW OVER THE PENCIL LINES AND, ONCE THE INK IS DRY, USE THE ERASER TO RUB OUT ANY PENCIL MARKS YOU SEE.
