New Zealand Contractors' Contra

Find out below how these competitions help to produce better skilled excavator operators, while promoting safer work practices in the industry...

Each year excavator operators from all over NZ compete for the title of "Operator of the Year". Finalists from regional competitions go forward to compete every March in Feilding, Manawatu.

Operators are put through a variety of tasks, including manoeuvring over a 'gas line', traversing a trench, lifting and relocation of a manhole cover and more. All of these tasks are designed to promote safe work practises and increase the skills of excavator operators.

Operators are required to demonstrate their knowledge of regulations related to Occupational Safety and Health, First Aid, Land Transport regulations and industry hazards.

Having completed the safety and regulation part of the contest the operators are required to manoeuvre a 12 tonne excavator through an obstacle course, staying clear of known hazards while completing tasks that demonstrate skills required by the industry of an excavator operator.
